The Auxiliary made a \$10,000 payment to the Foundation toward their \$250,000 pledge to the Neuroscience Institute.


We are looking forward to hosting the NW District Auxiliary Meeting on April 12.

It had/has a beautiful marbled interior and it was quite a grandiose and majestic building in 1980 when I visited it while it was a rehab center. It is still a noble structure serving a noble purpose and a sight to see. Long may it serve!
