DELTA MEMORIAL HOSPITAL Shirley Sandlin



There was not a lot going on in January. Our guest speaker this month at our meeting was Bill Yates, a retired educator from Waldron, Arkansas. You can follow Mr. Yates stories on his blog (growingupinWaldron.blogspot.com). One of the stories he shared with us was about little Pearl Turner. Pearl went missing on Friday morning, October 19, 1923. Her sisters were helping their father who was cutting firewood. Pearl, who was only three years old, wandered out to where they were working. Their father asked her sisters to take her back to the cabin so she wouldn't get hurt. They did this and left her at the cabin. No one would ever see her again. The family searched for a long time but never found her. There was talk that she had been kidnapped but was alive and grew up somewhere else. She was never found and to this day it remains a mystery. Her parents, Lynn and Lela Turner, died in 1969 wondering what happened to their daughter.

February was a slow month for us also. Our guest speaker was Alicia Cheshier with Jack's Helping Hands Snacks for Children. Alicia's grandson, Jack, was in an ATV accident on March 19, 2013 and died instantly. He was only seven years old. Prior to his accident Jack would take snacks from his home to school to give to children less fortunate than him. After his death, Alicia set up the program – Jack's Helping Hands Snacks for Children in memory of her grandson. It is a 501c3 nonprofit organization. She takes the snacks to the Alma elementary schools. The feedback she gets from the school states that 80% of the children partake of the snacks from this program.
